

Environmental protection is one of the three pillars of sustainability. The other two are social equity and economic viability. Together they provide the framework for implementing solutions for a better world.

Without a defined origin, the three pillars of sustainability became more pressing in the 1980s. But it was in 2015, when all United Nations member states adopted the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development that sustainability became part of the mainstream lexicon.

This Agenda established 17 sustainable development goals, which aim to preserve the environment, respect human rights and ensure economic viability. They are comprehensive goals, covering areas as distinct as poverty and education, industry, gender equality, responsible consumption and production, clean energy, ocean conservation or biodiversity restoration.

Sustainability targets make it easier for a group of people, companies or governments to organise themselves to work together to build sustainable systems. Whether they are global goals, like those of the UN, or goals that each government, company, group or person has set as their own. And this is only possible by balancing environment, society and economy.
